#### Free advocacy service

Communication Rights Australia advocates for people with disabilities whose rights are being infringed, with priority given to people with little or no speech (see note below). Communication Rights Australia can be approached by a person with a disability, carers and families, if they feel an individual's rights have been restricted. Communication Rights Australia also advocates for systemic change to reduce discrimination experienced by its members regarding key issues.

Note: 'People with little or no speech' means people with impairments in:

- expressive language
- speech
- pragmatics
- fluency
- voice.

#### Information

Communication Rights Australia provides information on human rights, key services, organisations and facilities available to address the needs of people with little or no speech.

If support coordination is included in your plan, our support coordinators can work with you to help build your skills and confidence to independently manage your plan in the long-term.
